

ellow Comrades, elected Officers and appointed, I am this year's district Judge Advocate! & Department By-laws Comish.

I am not hear to dictate, order, demand or admonish anyone for not following mandated procedures and guidelines established by the American Legion National and Department By-Laws.

What I am expected to do in the course of my duties when accepting my oath of office, is mentor, guide, suggest and direct any member and officer to the "Manual of Procedures" and their Post By-laws. It is suggested if I see or feel there may be an infraction of your post by-laws or any other standing rules under "Roberts Rule of Order", I should ask to meet with the officers and/or members requesting some clarification where I could advise or even clarify some misinterpretation of the by-laws or other American Legion practices, the Judge Advocate should be able to respond in a respective manner and/or bring these matters to the district Executive Board and I. If needed, we should be able to assist and guide them in the report that is delinquent and what they are required to complete for the benefit of their membership and their post.

Let us not allow difference of opinions, personal interpretation of by-laws and/or personality differences, we cannot let it impede our volunteer service to our Veterans, community and the American Legion, as Veterans Still Serving America. if you have any questions on the by-laws, protocols and parliamentary procedures, don't hesitate to give me a call, I will make an all-out effort to give you the answer if I don't have it at the time we can and will learn together, we are team American Legion.





Alcoholic Beverage Control

"Article V, Section 9. The Post Finance Officer and any officers and/or positions charged by the Post Bylaws with the responsibility of handling Post funds should be bonded under a blanket bond."

POST FIDELITY BOND RESOURCES

The new Bylaws wording "should be bonded", in essence, makes having a fidelity bond for your post an option. Not many post leaders are aware of this change in the department bylaws and how it requires posts to purchase a fidelity bond on their own. This may be a good topic to discuss with your Post Executive Committee.

Post with smaller monetary assets will need less while those with more, will need more coverage. How much coverage the Post wants should be decided by the Post membership at the recommendation of the Executive Committee. You should check your Post bylaws for expenditures.

If you do not have liability insurance or an agent, there are many resources available from an online search on "how to obtain fidelity bond for non-profit organizations". You might want to consider talking to at least three or more companies to compare rates and services. Asking them about their claim filing process could prove to be valuable. Researching each company for complaints (including the Better Business Bureau at www.bbb.org)

The PACT Act and your VA benefits

The PACT Act is a new law that expands VA health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances.

The PACT Act adds to the list of health conditions that we assume (or "presume") are caused by exposure to these substances. This law helps us provide generations of Veterans—and their survivors—with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.
